### Building and exhibitions update:

Work at the Culture Centre site is continuing at a great pace. Passers-by will now notice that the glazing is in place and the exterior is really beginning to take its final shape. The landscaping work is ongoing; the external classroom has been built using stone from the Old School to create an amphitheatre for outdoor learning and storytelling. The last exciting piece of work is to finish our accessible sensory garden, which we are developing together with local group *Incredible Edible*.

The team is busy adding the finishing touches to plans for the interior, which will include innovative heritage exhibitions, a brand new library, archive and café.
